

KEEPING IT GREEN - Today we return to **Ordinary Time** and the liturgical color **green**---the color of growing things, things with life coursing through them, things that are not done yet. Even though we

have little green around us during this time of year, perhaps winter is precisely the time to let the Liturgy lead us and remind us that growth and being open to growth is to be the **ordinary** experience of an **ordinary** Christian.



DO THE RIGHT THING - I do not think that the late Mrs. Rosa Parks knew when she resisted injustice on December 1, 1955 that God was going to use her ordinary act to transform her ordinary pastor, Dr. Martin

Luther King, Jr., into a leader for civil rights in our nation. As we join tomorrow with other Americans in celebrating the life and work of Dr. King that moved our society toward a more perfect union in the 1950's and 1960's, we remember that we simply don't know which of our "ordinary" acts God is going to render extraordinary through Grace. So, let us do the right thing, and leave the outcome up to God.




